The Arlington Park Race track's history spans more than 80 years. It is dubbed "the most beautiful track in America." This year the Park sponsored its 17th Annual Chicagoland Family Pet Expo. The Expo has been built on a tradition of offering family fun. There were more then 7 different animal species represented and 246 Exhibitors who occupied well over 340 booths on three levels at the Arlington Park facility. The exhibitors came from all over the United States. They commanded a patronage of just over 14,000 people.
