4 Pet Health Myths

MYTH 1: Parasite Prevention Isn't Necessary Year-Round

Jay Stewart D.V.M., a Companion Animal Parasite Council board member says some parasites, like roundworms and those carried by mosquitoes can

infect pets year round. To keep pets safe from fleas, ticks, heartworms, and intestinal parasites, you'll need to administer broad-spectrum parasite prevention medication once *every* month.

MYTH 2: Neutering Makes Dogs Soft.

Intact males are frustrated every time they smell a female dog in season. Dogs exhibit this frustration in a number of ways: a poor appetite for a few days spells of breaking house-training, and mounting other dogs or people's legs. Neutering can quiet these tendencies when done at a young age. At the same time, it won't diminish the dogs drive. Dr. Danielle Wehr D.V.M. states, "It can also protect against testicular cancer and enlarged prostate, as well as dramatically reducing the incidence of perianal cancer."

MYTH 3: Itchy Ears Must Mean Ear Mites.

Generally ear mites are found in dogs who are living in deplorable situations. Most often, the family dog scratches its ear because of a yeast or bacterial infection. Persistence scratching warrants a visit to your vet.

MYTH 4: The Only Way To Show Pets Love is Through Food

Dr. Jay Steward D.V.M. states: "Too much food isn't affection, it's a health risk. If you want to show your pet love, active playtime is one of the best ways to do it."

Arrive at the competition early and sign-in/register on time.

Always clean up after your dog!

Listen for the order of competition, and be ready to go when it is your turn.

Walk your dog to and from the throwing line on lead.

Always respect every competitor's dog's space.

When you are finished with your round, gather your dog and leave the field quickly.

Never let your dog off lead near the competition field, unless to compete.

Never allow anyone, especially a child to be eye level with your dog, no matter how docile your dog may be.

Always walk around the competition field, never across it.

Never talk to judges while they are working. Wait until they are not judging and talk with them then.

Keep your dog under control at all times. You are responsible for your dog's actions whether you are paying attention to them or not.

Don't walk your dogs through other people's tents, be careful & courteous.

This is a family event, keep negative emotions and inappropriate language under control.

Cairo, the dog who helped kill Osama

MORE SEEK TO ADOPT K9 HEROES

A dog can be your best friend or your worst enemy. Thank God Cairo was on our side. Life after the military is looking brighter than ever for America's four-legged veterans since one of their own helped in the mission to eliminate Osama bin Laden. War dog organizations say the number of people asking about adopting retired military canines has risen dramatically since the mission involving Cairo, the Navy SEALs' dog. Military officials say they've received more than 400 adoption applications in the three weeks since the May 2nd raid. About 300 retired U.S. military dogs are put up for adoption each year. Cairo who joined the Navy SEALs in their raid on the bin Laden compound in Pakistan is not your ordinary pooch. Outfitted with special gear that allow the SEAL handler to see what the dog sees, voice commands at low level into the dog's ear, and the dog itself is protected with body armor that can withstand bullets from 9mm and .45 caliber magnum bullets. The vest and equipment cost around \$30,000. That is cheap when you put in perspective what the canine can do. It's sense of smell, it's hearing, it's speed, and ability to get into small tunnels, make it something a human can never do. Want to learn more? Check out:
