What can I tell you about Sheridan Gilchrist? Well there is a plethora of positive material in Sheridan's dossier. Let's start at the beginning. God gave Sheridan *a deep compassion and desire to help those creatures that need our help the most.* She is a hard worker who takes her commitments seriously. If don't know this fact, you have been sleeping under a rock. I think you will be pleasantly impressed as the article goes forward.

The Stats: Sheridan Gilchrist hails from the Chicago suburb of Glen Ellyn, Illinois. She is the oldest of three daughters. Her son, David, celebrated his 24th birthday this year, 2012. Sheridan has been employed with the Future Farmers of America in Indianapolis for ten years. She is their Senior Team Leader for Customer Service. She loves the color blue and anything chocolate. One of her favorite modes of relaxing is hanging out with her dogs on a beautiful afternoon while puttering in her yard, with a glass of iced tea near by. Sheridan is enamored with the German Shorthair Pointer Breed.

The Person: In the past two years Sheridan has volunteered with the <u>Illinois Shorthair Rescue</u>. She fosters and transports rescued German Shorthair Pointers to Chicago. In the 1970's she was introduced to her first of many German Shorthair Pointers. A sweet gal she named Sally. Sally was great with kids. With the help of Sheridan and a Frisbee, Sally entertained and delighted school kids for many years. Next came a duo of German Shorthair Pointer hunting dogs named Jady and her daughter Blaze. They were Gilchrist family members for fourteen happy years. Through the years that followed, Sheridan opened her tremendous heart, wallet and door to many needy dogs. She didn't gravitate to only healthy dogs. Many of her personal dogs are needy rescues with serious health issues...Dogs that very few want to take on personally. These dogs are consequently destined to be euthanized. Many of us have met Sheridan's Roxie and Sierra. They were mixed breeds. Roxie was a Frisbee dog. She developed Cushing's and Pancreatic Insufficiency. Sierra developed a heart condition and wore a pacemaker. Sierra passed away in August 2012. and Roxie in 2011. Next came Bella, a Cattle Dog mix, who also had a heart condition and wound up with a vascular plug that corrected her condition. Thanks to Sheridan's guidance and God's will she was given many quality years on earth in spite of her challenges. Sheridan's next personal rescue was a dog in his twilight years. A 12 year old dog named Hunter. In the system, Hunter would have been euthanized long ago, never knowing love or any heighten quality of life. He was battling seizures, deafness, a large non-cancerous tumor and Cushing's disease. Sheridan stated: "One of Hunter's joys in life was rearranging her books into tiny pieces." I suspicion Hunter felt that any good read should last a little longer (bit by bit). He lived two more years under his master's tender wings. All of the dogs above had one valuable gift in common; Sheridan. This compassionate lady stands deservedly with all those who strive to give needy animals much love, a better quality of life, and comfort and dignity in life and death.

The Club Member: In 2005, Sheridan decided to investigate the Indy Dog & Disc Club. She attended a club play date at Eagle Creek Park in her current hometown of Indianapolis, IN. Soon after, she joined IDDC. In 2006, Ron King, club president at the time, was in need of a scorekeeper for his competitions. Sheridan volunteered. This was the start of much club volunteering for Sheridan. She joined the IDDC Board in 2008 sharing the position of Event Coordinator with Carol Herbertz. In 2011 she took on the position solely. In 2010, Sheridan took on the huge task of hosting the IDDC Gretchen Invitational competition held in Kokomo. IN. She continues to do so. This year, 2012, she volunteered to host another club competition, the Skyhoundz North Central Regional held in New Castle, IN. Last Spring Sheridan also took over coordinating the IDDC play date sessions. This year Jeff Hoot took a must needed rest from his popular Quadruped. Gary Duke volunteered to step in for Hoot and Sheridan volunteered to help Gary by performing secretarial duties for the Quad competitions. This summer Sheridan traveled to all five of the competitions held in Kokomo, IN, Lakeland, FL, Houston, TX, Lawrence, KS and Denver, CO. That is a lot of time, effort and money on Sheridan's part, and she is one who never fails to step up and be counted. The Army would love Sheridan and they would be very lucky to have her!!!!!!

Today Sheridan is enjoying four dogs, German Shorthair Pointers. Darwin, is 7 years old and enjoys agility. Bruno, whom most disc doggers know is a lovable, easy going, handsome Pointer who is right at home on the field with his pink discs, pink panther music and his mom. Sheridan rescued Bruno from an excellent canine training program conducted through the penal system. Bruno recently retired from the sport of disc dog but occasionally delights us with his performances at IDDC Shows. Sheridan has brought on board two young foster dogs to take up Bruno's gauntlet. Ryder is 2 years old and Stryker is 1½ years old. They are packed with personality and have a penchant for the disc.

He has surprisingly been pretty good lately. Although we are seeing a gradual progression in his symptoms (increased right hind weakness/balance), his spirits seem to be better and he is keener than ever to play frisbee, etc. He played in Bullseye today at the Discdogathon qualifier (happy to play) and is entered in D/A for Friday and playing Freestyle with Dennis' 5-year old daughter Mackenzie on Friday was well. Looking forward to seeing that! :-)

His hair loss sucks... pretty much no undercoat left and some small bald patches, but not "really" bad since his hair colour is similar to his skin colour. :-) His blood test results have been okay, but his WBC count has been on the low side. No other major side effects from the drugs, so that is good.

He was given a 3-7 month prognosis, and we are past 3 months now... hopefully they are wrong, but I suspect the end of the year will be tough for us. But we just keep enjoying each day we can with him and as long as he is happy, we are happy. :-)


